1. Official Languages

The official language of SSIMF 2025 is English. All presentations, including Q&A sessions, must be delivered in English.

2. Guideline for Participants

2.1. Conference Venue and Time:

- Location: Level 7, BLK C, Singapore University of Social Sciences (463 Clementi Rd, Singapore).
- **Time Zone:** Conference schedules are listed in Local Standard Time (GMT+8).

2.2. Conference Kit:

• A conference kit, containing the final program and name badge, will be provided to participants during check-in at the Registration/Information Desk.

2.3. Lunch Time:

• Lunch will be provided from 12:00 to 12:30 on December 19, 2025 (GMT +8).

2.4. Banquet Time:

The banquet opening time is from 17:30 to 18:00 on December 19, 2025 (GMT +8).

3. Guidelines for Presenters

3.1. Paper Sequence:

 Presenters and session chairs are required to adhere to the paper sequence as outlined in the Final Program. This ensures that participants can switch between sessions without missing any papers of interest.

3.2. Presentation Time:

- **Oral Presenters:** Each oral presenter is allocated 15 minutes: 12 minutes for the presentation and 3 minutes for discussion.
- **Poster Presenters:** Each poster presenter is allocated 60 minutes.

3.3. Presentation Language:

All SSIMF 2025 papers must be presented in English.

Paper Presentation Guideline

1. Enrollment at the Conference Reception Desk:

Participants must enroll at the registration counter with only the first paper ID.
 The second paper ID does not need to be enrolled at the counter.

2. On-Site Oral Paper Presentation:

• Each paper is allocated 15 minutes for presentation, including discussion time. A maximum of 15 slides for the presentation is recommended. Presentation files should be saved on a flash drive and brought to the conference before the sessions begin.

3. Online Oral Paper Presentation via Zoom Meetings (Remote):

• Each paper is allocated 15 minutes for presentation, including discussion time. A maximum of 15 slides for the presentation is recommended. Online oral presentations should be conducted remotely via Zoom Meetings. Online presenters must change their display name to "*Paper No._Full English Name*" on **Zoom Meetings**.








4. On-Site Poster Paper Presentation:
